Third Grader's Story Inspires Donation to HSFM

Throughout the school year, Bonnie Leier's third grade students at Fargo's McKinley Elementary complete several projects which allow them to better understand the social studies standards of producers/consumers, supply/demand, cost vs. profit and etc. In her classroom she runs a couple different activities to meet these standards, one being "Kidz Giftland". After the projects are complete, third grade students have the option of writing a persuasive speech to encourage other classmates to vote for the charity they are writing about. This year, shortly before Christmas, the Humane Society Fargo-Moorhead was one of two organizations chosen to donate \$200 to because of the persuasive speech written by third grader Arden Faulkner. The following is the speech she wrote that encouraged the rest of her classmates to choose HSFM as one of their donation

Imagine being locked up in a kennel with lots of other dogs. There are 170 of us. It is cold. It is hot. It is dark. It is noisy. There is no food. There is no clean water. I bark - hoping someone will come. Nobody does.

Finally, I hear something. A noise I have never heard. I am not sure what to think. The door opens. There are lots of people. Some have shiny badges on their shirts and then I hear something about being taken away. I start to cry. Then I hear lots of crying. I can't tell if it is the dogs or if it is the people that have come to the barn to take all of us away. I am scared. More scared than I have ever been. Then I am put into a truck and taken to a big doctor office for animals. I get a haircut and some shots. I can see so much now. There is still a lot of noise.

I am there a few days and then I go to a nice red building where I can run outside and feel the warm sun. It is the FM Humane Society. I am sitting outside smelling the fresh air and then I see a woman and 2 little girls. They sit down to talk to me and some of my buddies. I go to the corner afraid of what will happen. Then I feel a warm touch. I like it. I am picked up and go for a ride in the car. When we stop, the lady and girls carry me to a big green area that tickles my feet. Then I hear them talk about a bath. Uh oh. I don't think that sounds like fun, but then I feel the warm water. The smell of the shampoo. Mmmm. I feel so clean. I meet a couple other dogs and some little things in the house that meow



at me. There are so many warm places to sleep. I get lots of hugs and kisses. They give me a name - Howie. I like it! Actually, I love it! I got to stay there with them for 2 months. They were great people and I felt loved. Then a nice couple came to visit me and decided to

I now live with my new brother. His name is Charles. My mom's name is Traci and my dad's name is Richard.


