

Homeward Animal Shelter Offers Basic Dog Obedience Classes

We are offering basic dog obedience classes to teach owners how to communicate with their dogs, while teaching them basic commands and manners, and in doing so, strengthening the bond between the dog and their owner(s).

Classes are one hour per week, for a total of 6 weeks. We will be offering classes on Tuesday nights, beginning March 8th, and Wednesday nights, beginning March 9th. Special Pets Looking for Special Homes

Sharla, a six year old black cocker spaniel, came to us through the pound in early October, 2015. Once in our care, it was determined she needed immediate veterinary attention. Sharla suffers from several treatable health conditions, and while in our care, has had corrective eye surgery to address just one of her health concerns. In addition, Sharla will need a double ear surgery. Years of chronic ear infections and lack of previous care has caused her ear canals to become extremely thickened and scarred. Surgery to help reconstruct her ear canals will ease her discomfort and pain and relieve her of the chronic ear infections.

When asked to describe Sharla, the staff lovingly described her as "*a very sweet and mild-mannered dog. She loves treats and enjoys hanging out with the volunteers and staff*".



Topeka is a four month old female kitten that came to our shelter from a local pound. Shortly after her arrival, we noticed that she would walk with what appeared to be a stiff leg. A vet exam revealed that Topeka has what is called a "medial luxating patella", which means that her kneecap has moved to the inside of her one leg, and unfortunately, it does not appear that it moves back into place as it should. Surgery is recommended to fix the situation, however, due to her young age, it is advised that the surgery wait until she is more full-grown. Topeka will need a very dedicated new owner who will ensure that this surgery is completed when she is of age. Unfortunately, this means she will likely wait much longer than the average kitten to find a home. If you are interested in helping out a special kitten, Topeka would be a great choice! Swatch is a three year old male Bulldog/Pit bull mix, who is currently heartworm positive. Treatment for heartworm takes roughly 4 months, and Swatch is already nearly half done, but needs a special home to finish the treatment in. During the last 2 months of treatment, Swatch will need to be confined to a kennel or monitored to ensure he remains calm at all times. Once he completes the treatment, he will be heartworm-free and will just need to remain on a heartworm preventative medication, as a normal dog would, for the rest of his life. Swatch is a very sweet boy, who loves humans, but would prefer to be the only 4-legged critter in the home. He loves to be a cuddlebug and will lie down and just hang out; he's a bit of a couch potato. If you're interested in learning more about Swatch, please contact the shelter!
